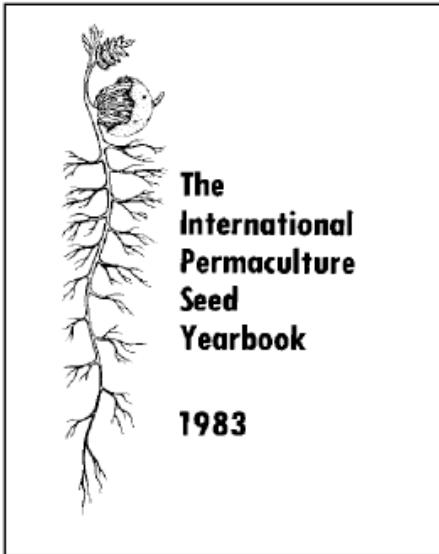

TIPSY #1.

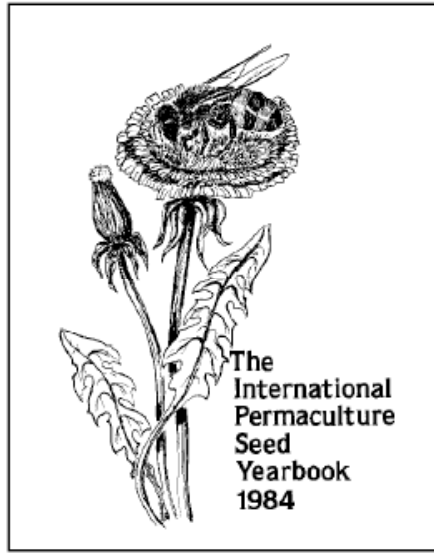

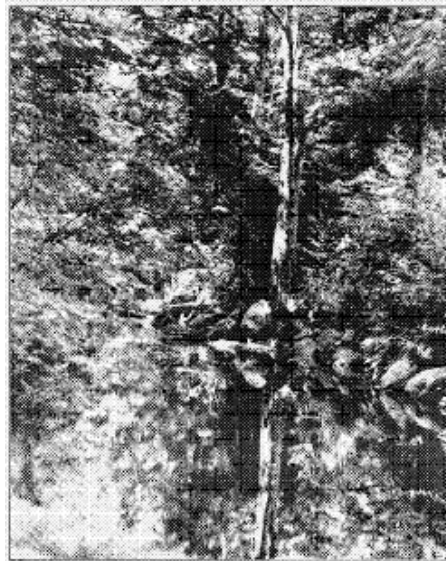

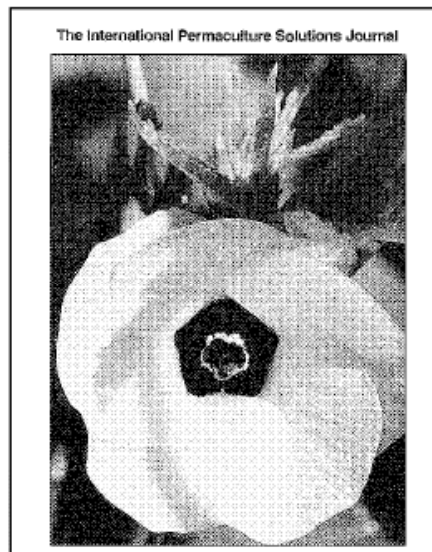
